## WHY THE SWISS MATURA?

The Swiss Matura is a demanding, highly respected academic qualification that is often seen as a gateway to prestigious universities globally:

- 2. <u>No entrance exams in Switzerland</u>: In contrary to other diploma (IB diploma, French baccalaureate), students graduating with the Swiss Matura can directly enroll in Swiss universities like ETH Zurich and the University of Geneva without the need for additional entrance exams.
- Recognized by Ivy League and Top Universities: The Swiss Matura's reputation for rigor makes it attractive to top-tier institutions in the US (Ivy league universities) and the UK (Oxford/Cambridge).
